

CURRICULAR AND NON-CURRICULAR SUBJECTS AT LE RÉGENT 2021-22

The following subjects are in the standard Le Régent curriculum and are obligatory or are offered as options for all junior and secondary students:

From Grades 2 to 10 inclusive:

- English at a variety of levels from first language (mother tongue) to beginner
- French at a variety of levels from first language (mother tongue) to beginner
- Mathematics
- General Science
- History
- Geography
- (History and Geography as a Humanities course in Grades 2, 3 and 4)
- Art
- Music (up to Grade 8)
- Computing
- LAMDA (public speaking/drama)
- Spanish as a foreign language
- Mandarin as a foreign language
- Sport and PE (Physical Education)
- Life skills/PSHE (Physical Social and Health Education)

Extra classes in most subjects are available and many other subjects are covered in the activities programme. Other subjects can sometimes be offered for extra payment.

IB (all subjects at High or Standard Levels except where indicated otherwise)

- English A
- English B (HL only)
- French A
- French B
- French ab initio (SL only since the IB does not have a HL course)
- Spanish B
- History
- Geography
- Information Technology in Global Societies
- Business and Management
- Economics
- Biology
- Chemistry
- Physics
- Environmental Systems and Societies (SL only since the IB does not have a HL course)
- Mathematics AA (Analysis and Approaches)
- Mathematics AI (Applications and Interpretation- SL only)
- Visual Arts

For some subjects demand is irregular and/or limited but students can take courses as part of their IB Diploma Programme in the following:

- Language A literature in: Chinese, Japanese, Russian, Italian, German. Normally, we prefer these to be followed with a teacher, but if a teacher is not available, some are offered under the the IB's "School-Supported Self-Taught" scheme which exists at Standard Level only.
- Language ab initio (beginner) in Spanish and Mandarin
- Computer Science
- Music

In all cases, we urge students and parents to contact the school to discuss options and costs of extra courses.
